





OUR STORY

Northern Frontier Camp is a place where stories are told. Moments become memories grown and passed around a campfire, hiking on a trail, or traveling home from another adventurous week at camp. Each experience becomes part of the story we've been telling since 1946.

First known simply as Frontier Camp, we started as a group of men committed to the cause of building up the next generation of godly men. They were spurred on by Joe Coughlin, a visionary ministry leader and founder of Christian Service Brigade. Known as the Frontiersmen, they traveled in station wagons hosting week-long campouts. Boys came to learn skills, play games, and hear the good news of Jesus Christ.

For twenty years, faithful men like Lee Troup and Bruce Baker kept the camp growing as

it moved from various locations. In 1958, the Brigade Camping Association was formed to acquire a permanent place for Frontier Camp. After a lengthy search, the decision was made to lease a property in North River, New York, in 1964. The summer of 1966 welcomed the first cabins of campers, and we found a place to call our home.

From the beginning, Northern Frontier Camp has aimed to help boys and young men grow in their walk with God. We provide intentional challenges designed to encourage personal growth that is spiritual, physical, and emotional. Our campers engage in many activities where they gain experience in camp skills, grow in godly character, and learn Christian service.





Each morning, our campers wake up at 7:45 and get ready for a brand new day. They'll head to the field for the flag-raising and morning line-up. Breakfast is served in our Dining Hall at 8:30, with a new menu each day. Afterward, they'll head back to their cabins for Bible-Ex, a time to dive into and discuss God's Word!


Next, they'll head out for a Morning Activity where campers will experience exciting camp activities like Rock Climbing, Woodshop, Archery, Sailing, and much more! Younger campers will experience a new Action Time each day, which can be anything from a Frog Race to the Stockade Rumble.

Our older campers jump into their first swim time of the day at the Waterfront. They can leap off the high dive, go fishing, take out a boat, or play volleyball on the beach. At 1:00, everyone will come together in our Dining Hall for another meal served fresh from the kitchen.

The afternoon features more Camp Activities and Swim Time. We also open our Camp Store, where campers can enjoy a variety of snacks and soft drinks. Dinner is served at 6:00, followed by a big group activity. Each night there's something different, like Water polo, Capture the Flag, an Evening Hike, and more!

As the day winds down, campers again report to the field to lower the flag. From there, they'll gather around a campfire to sing silly songs, be entertained by a funny skit, and lift their voices in worship. The campfire concludes with a story told by one of our staff. Each story is unique, whether it be a legend of old, a personal testimony, or a bible story retold, and ends with a meaningful application from Scripture.

At 9:45, campers return to their cabins, wash up for bed, share stories about what happened that day, and turn in–ready for another day of adventure!

Our father-and-son programs are loaded with opportunities to spend one-on-one, growing closer to God together!


